



The Danube winds its way through Lower Austria like a blue ribbon 260 km long. This section is perhaps the most charming of any along the entire river, featuring magnificent architecture, picturesque towns and villages on the banks, and top wine culture. In December 2000, the Wachau was added to the UNESCO World Heritage list as the only region along the Danube and at the end of 2008 it was dubbed "Best Historic Destination in the World" by National Geographic Traveler Magazine. www.donau.com

Wines of international caliber

The subregions along the Danube in Lower Austria have one thing in common: superb wine culture. Six of the eight Lower Austrian wine regions containing some of the most famous single vineyards in Austria are along the Danube: Wachau, Krems Valley, Kamp Valley, Traisen Valley, Wagram and Carnuntum. Wines flourish here thanks to the diverse soils and the ideal climate that combines moist Atlantic influences with dry Pannonian ones. Wachau Rieslings are famous the world over, for example, and 'Grüner Veltliner' is the most typical grape variety in the region. www.donau.com/weinstrassen

Wine tasting

Visitors should definitely sample the excellent wines in the Danube region of Lower Austria just the way the locals do: in the down-to-earth atmosphere of a heuriger wine tavern. At 'Heurige', wine makers serve their own wines and tasty traditional delicacies. Many private wine makers also welcome groups to come for wine tasting events. For full immersion in Wachau viticulture, for instance, the unique wine experience at 'Winzer Krems' is highly recommended or a cellar tour at 'Domäne Wachau'.

THE DANUBE AS THE YEAR UNFOLDS A REGION CELEBRATES ITS FESTIVALS AND ITS TRADITIONS

April/May: Wine spring

This celebration of wine and springtime in the Danube wine region is the best opportunity each year to sample wines directly at the wineries that produce them. Tips: '3-Valley Weinfrühling', 'Tour de Vin' of traditional Austrian wineries, the 'Wachau Weinfrühling' or the 'Loess Frühling'.

June: Garden Festival in Tulln

Tulln is a town of gardens and also Egon Schiele's birthplace. In June the focus is very much on gardens. The public is invited to visit private gardens on tours and the entire town is decked out with flowers.

June through August: Festivals along cellar-lined roads

The Danube region of Lower Austria has many picturesque country roads lined with wine cellars. On certain dates, they serve as a wonderful backdrop for open-air wine festivals.

The end of June:

Solstice festivals in the Wachau + Nibelungengau

More than 20 towns in the Wachau-Nibelungengau-Krems Valley part of the Danube region stage solstice festivals at midsummer every year. Romantic torches light up the vineyards and impressive fireworks are set off. A beautiful way of experiencing this spectacle is from aboard a Danube ship. www.sonnenwende.at

July through September: Festival Summer

Along with its impressive historical and cultural legacy, the Danube region in Lower Austria has a lively contemporary culture scene. Summertime is culture time, with the world music festival 'Glatt & Verkehrt' and the 'Grafenegg Festival', a high-caliber, internationally known classical music festival. Other highlights are the theater festival 'Sommerspiele Melk' or the 'Art Mile' in Krems, where interesting exhibitions are staged throughout the year.

July: Apricot festivals

In July the big event is the apricot harvest. In mid-July every year, visitors can look forward to light, fluffy apricot dumplings, fruity apricot punch and the finest in apricot brandies at the big apricot festivals in Krems and Spitz.

September and October: Wine autumn with harvest festivals

'Weinherbst' is the Lower Austrian celebration of wine and autumn. The season begins with the grape harvest and proceeds with a series of wine festivals and parades in the region.

November, December: Advent along the Danube

The Wachau is a UNESCO World Heritage landscape. Its splendid monasteries, churches and fortresses make a memorable backdrop for the many Advent events held at special locations throughout the area.



Mühldorf Bakery Museum

The old bakery contains all manner of historical gadgets and utensils that can be experienced on a tour or during a baking demonstration. There is also an historical toy shop that is open to the public. www.baeckereimuseum.at

Marillenhof Kausl, apricot farm

This apricot farmer produces liquid and solid products from Wachau apricots and even distills his own Wachau Whiskey. Visitors can taste and experience so much about the processing of Wachau apricots. www.marillenhof.at

City and vineyard tours in Spitz

This wine town in the Wachau is an ideal base for vineyard hikes to the Thousand Barrel Mountain with its many views or to the Red Gate. City tours that include church visits are also available. Wine tasting can be staged at a heuriger wine tavern, in a wine cellar or at Klosterhof. *Information & reservations: Donau Incoming, incoming@donau.com*

DESCRIPTION:

Spitz encircles the base of the Thousand Barrel Mountain vineyard like a precious collar. Marktstrasse winds its way up from the Danube past wineries and to the church, whose chancel is famously out of line with the nave. A side-trip to the former city gate (Red Gate) has its rewards: impressive views of Spitz. www.spitz-wachau.at

DESCRIPTION:

An especially striking structure in this scenic town in the heart of the Wachau is the mighty church in the town center with its wood-covered stairway and the historical Renaissance complex Teisenhoferhof.
